

Message from the PPOL Finance Team IMPORTANT TAX INFORMATION REGARDING DONATIONS TO THE PPOL



One may always make a charitable donation to the Pikes Peak Opera League Virtuoso Society, Legacy Fund or the Pikes Peak Opera League (PPOL) by simply writing a check and using "Schedule A Itemized Deductions" to report your donation to the IRS. However, if you are now required to take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from a tax-deferred retirement account, such as an IRA, and your tax deductions are no longer large enough to use Schedule A (the Standard deduction is now larger that your Schedule A deductions), you may want to consider the use of a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) to make deductions to a qualified charity such as the PPOL Virtuoso Society.

If you were born prior to July 1, 1949 (reaching age 70½ prior to January 1, 2020) IRS rules state that you must take a Required Minimum Distribution each year from your tax-deferred retirement accounts (this tax rule was amended in December 2020 to allow those persons reaching age 70½ in the year 2020 or later, to wait until they are 72 to take the RMD.) A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from an IRA, payable to a qualified charity (ask your charities to which you intend to donate for their tax code and if they are considered a qualified charity by the IRS.) Amounts distributed by a QCD can be counted toward satisfying your Required Minimum Distribution for the year (up to \$100,000) and can be excluded from your taxable income. The amount of money donated using a QCD will not only reduce your tax payment but may also drop your taxable income into a lower tax bracket.

The Pikes Peak Opera League is a qualified charity and accepts donations through a Qualified Charitable Distribution. However, we cannot give tax or legal advice and recommend donors consult their tax professional before making a gift. Mary McKinley shares excerpts from the **January Opera News** feature on her nephew, Craig Irvin: The Iowa baritone is a powerful singer and incisive actor. This month at Utah Opera, baritone Craig Irvin will sing Lieutenant Horstmayer in *Silent Night* for the eighth time since creating the role at Minnesota Opera in 2011. Still, that's nothing compared to one of his first breaks as Gaston in a thirty minute version of *Beauty and the Beast* at Disney World after the end of his contract with Orlando Opera. Other roles Irvin has found rewarding include Mandryka in Strauss's Arabella in Minnesota in 2013 and Macbeth with Loft Opera in 2016. In April, he sang Valentin in Gounod's *Faust* at Opera Omaha, where he stole the show with his brawny physicality and raw emotion. His singing technique is solid, but he's also an affecting actor. He even pops into improv classes at Second City when he's in Toronto in order to hone his craft.

"I have to have an artistic outlet," he says. Once, when he had a long break in his schedule, he started writing poetry and enjoyed going to poetry readings. He does Standup on open mic nights when he travels as he feels it makes him a better performer. Once a member of the Ryan Center at Lyric Opera of Chicago, Irvin got his undergraduate degree at Simpson College, close to his hometown of Waukee, Iowa. He currently lives in Des Moines. "Being a professional opera singer and living in Des Moines is like being a professional surfer and living in Des Moines." He lives with his wife and three children near his brothers and parents and credits his family unit for helping immeasurably when he's traveling for opera roles.





